



Success for the Autoadapt sponsored exhibition during the Paralympic Winter Games in Turin!

Autoadapt took a major part in the Swedish exhibition arranged by the Ministry for Foreign Affairs and the Swedish Trade Council.

The exhibition "Un Mondo a Misura di Ogni Bambino" i.e. "A World Adapted to Every Child" drew many visitors during the IX Paralympic Winter Games 10-19 March in Turin, Italy. The purpose of the exhibition was to demonstrate the possibilities of well functioning assistive technical aids for children and young people with disabilities.

H.R.H. Crown Princess Victoria opened the exhibition, consisting of 202 technical aids from over 40 Swedish companies, by tying a symbolic knot of Italian and Swedish ribbons. Then she walked through the exhibition and was ofcourse briefed about the Autoadapt products by Peter Wahlsten, Autoadapt Vice President and Marketing Director.

"It is very interesting to see how the Autoadapt solutions can improve quality of life for impaired children," said Crown Princess Victoria, as it is well-known that supporting recreational activities for disabled children and youths is close to the Crown Princess's heart.

During the 12 days of opening the exhibition got a full media coverage in TV, radio and newspapers. A Swedish VIP-delegation also took a close look at the Autoadapt stand. The Deputy Prime Minister, and Minister of Sports, Bosse Ringholm, squeezed himself into the Carony Kids wheelchair urging to get a ride, applauded by Karin Mattsson., chairman of the Swedish Sports Confederation.
